



All Fares to Increase Effective April 1

It has been normal business practice for Trans-Bridge Lines to have an annual general fare increase on our One-Way and Round-Trip ticket prices. When we do this, we also set a new base fare for commuter rates.

Our last fare adjustment was over a year ago in November 2020. Shortly thereafter, prices begin escalating on goods and services. During these last 18+ months, we absorbed these increases, choosing not to pass them along to our passengers.

Due to the effects of the global pandemic and other

economic factors, the cost of goods and services has unfortunately now increased to exceptional levels for everyone from industry to consumers. With inflation steadily increasing to the current 7.9% and the price of fuel skyrocketing, we have no alternative but to adjust our pricing accordingly. Please understand that

adjust our pricing accordingly. Please understand that fuel costs are included in the new fares, and although fares are increasing, they are not being raised to the full levels that were indicted as necessary. This is to minimize the cost to our passengers.

In addition, commuter increases will be held to the same percentage rate as previously used in March.

New pricing will become effective April 1, 2022.

Should the fuel prices continue to escalate, we will be forced to increase our fuel percentages used for pricing. If fuel decreases, we will look at reducing that percentage.

Commuter Book rates will continue to be modified month-to-month, as usual, based on fuel costs.

Busing on the Lookout

Busing on the Lookout (BOTL), a program of Truckers Against Trafficking (TAT), exists to educate and equip all members of the bus industry and those who use it with the information necessary to enable them to fight human trafficking.

Human trafficking occurs at bus terminals and stops. Victims are often transported by bus. Human Traffickers look for

primarily minors and young adults. Things to look for include:

- Passengers who are not allowed to speak for self
- Disheveled appearance, agitated, scared/crying
- Minors traveling without adult supervision
- Offers to exchange sex for a ride, meal, etc.
- Does not know the person who is picking them up
- Any acknowledgment of having a pimp or needing to make a quota
- Signs of branding or tattooing (often of trafficker's name)
- Passengers not in possession of own ticket, money or ID

Please remember that many of our commuter passengers use their travel time to rest or sleep. Although passengers are allowed to use tablets, laptops, and cell phones, these items should be used at zero or low volumes. In addition, please be courteous with the brightness of devices, minimizing the level or sitting towards the back of the bus where the brightness will not bother those sitting behind you.



Smoking Policy ... Smoking is not permitted on Trans-Bridge Lines motorcoaches. This includes electronic cigarettes and vaporizers. This policy also applies to our drivers. Keep in mind, however, that if a driver is a smoker, the odor may linger on his/her clothing. All drivers are instructed to make sure the bus door is closed when smoking outside of the bus, to ensure the odor does not enter the bus.

COMMUTER TICKET EXPIRATIONS

All 10, 20, 30, and 40-trip Commuter Book tickets are available at our Authorized Ticket Agent locations with the exception of the Port Authority Bus Terminal and Newark Airport. All Multi-Ride tickets are valid for 30 days from the date of purchase. An extended expiration period of 3 business days is given on 30-trip books, and 4 business days on 40-trip books. No extended expiration period is given on 10 and 20-trip books. All requests for Commuter Book refunds must be made within 30 days from date of purchase.

COVID-19 EXTENSIONS

Trans-Bridge Lines will extend the expiration date on any tickets purchased during the time period of our company's COVID-19 shutdown in March of 2020. If you have tickets to extend, please send your details and a photo of your tickets to webmaster@transbridgelines.com.



Trans-Bridge Lines Ticket Sales are Going Cashless at LVIA

Effective May 1, 2022, Lehigh Valley International Airport (ABE) will no longer accept cash transactions for Trans-Bridge Lines tickets. As companies made the move to cashless transactions during the COVID-19 pandemic, ABE will also make the transition to be a fully cashless operation based on advice from healthcare professionals.

With fewer individuals carrying cash for their purchases, the decision will also increase efficiency at checkout for passengers who need to obtain their tickets and head to the intermodal for their bus.

For individuals who do not carry debit or credit cards, you may purchase your tickets with cash at our main office at 2012 Industrial Drive, Bethlehem, just off Schoenersville Road. The office, which is less than one mile from the airport, operates Monday through Friday, 7:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Additionally, a Cash Fare may be purchased from the motorcoach driver. This is a premium service and contains an additional surcharge. Passengers are expected to provide the exact fare as drivers do not carry monies to make change.
