# Ticketing Policies to be Enforced Beginning March 1

When Trans-Bridge Lines transitioned to full reservations on Monday, December 18, we informed our passengers that we would be flexible with ticket use and rescheduling while everyone adjusted to our new procedures.

If a One-Way or Round-Trip ticket holder wishes to cancel their travel before their scheduled travel date and receive credit, they must contact our Customer Service Department at

610-868-6001 for assistance.

Now, after two months of operating within the perimeters of reservations, it is time to enforce our rules on ticket use.

## What are the rules and how are they different from the past?

All One-Way and Round-Trip tickets are no longer valid for six months. Tickets are valid for the day, time, and run they are scheduled only. Tickets, however, may be rescheduled up to the original departure time. Tickets rescheduled within 30 minutes of the original departure time will be charged \$2 per ticket. Before that, there is no fee to reschedule. After the scheduled departure time, any unused ticket is expired and becomes null and void. There will then be no rescheduling, credits, or refunds permitted.

When a ticket is unused but the space is reserved for you on the bus, it represents the loss of a sold seat and is why we do not allow rescheduling, For those with Commuter Passes, you are afforded up to 16 hours passed a missed run to reschedule your ticket. There are no rescheduling fees. You may also choose to cancel a scheduled run and that ticket will be added back to your Commuter Pass for scheduling at another time within the Pass' timeframe for use. If you do not cancel or reschedule after the 16 hours, the ticket is null and void and not eligible to be rescheduled, credited, or refunded.

We recognize that there will be exceptions such allowing tickets to be rescheduled due to run cancellations, and weather events. If any of our passengers feel they have a specific situation which warrants an exception, please contact our Customer Service Department or <a href="mailto:e

Q: I bought a Round-Trip ticket and used my first boarding pass without any issue. On my return trip, however, the driver said my ticket was expired! What happened?

A: You appeared to have used your second ticket for the first half of your journey. Therefore, when you presented the first ticket for your return trip, it indicated it was expired/used. The day and time has passed, making the ticket expired and null and void.

All passengers should be careful to present the correct boarding pass for the correct portion of their journey. Always be sure you are using the boarding pass that correlates with the run number booked. If you are unsure that you are presenting the correct portion of your ticket, ask the driver when boarding.

#### **Run 176**

As noted on our Allentown/ Clinton/New York Schedules, Run 176 will depart from the Port Authority at 8:30 p.m. on Fridays. Monday through Thursday, the run departs at 8:00 p.m.

We have been made aware that the tickets and itinerary reflect the 8:00 p.m. time whenever a passenger makes a Friday purchase. This is causing some confusion and frustration for passengers who believe the run to be departing late from the Port.

We have made an adjustment on our ticketing platform and the correct time will now be reflected on the ticket and itinerary for Run 176F (Friday).
