Trans-Bridge Expands Newark Airport Service



Good news! We are pleased to announce the expansion of our service to Newark Liberty International Airport with the addition of two new runs!

This move comes in direct response to United Airlines' recent cessation of its Landline bus service between Lehigh Valley International Airport and Newark Airport.

By introducing these new shuttle connections, we will fill an important gap in service, ensuring that travelers in the region continue to have seamless and affordable access to major transportation hubs.

"Listening to the needs of our passengers has always been at the heart of our operations," said Tom JeBran, President, "With the need for reliable airport transportation and requests for service, we are proud to step in and provide these options. Our goal is to keep the Lehigh Valley and surrounding communities connected to the destinations they use most."

The expanded Newark Airport runs will begin effective Monday, September 8, and run daily, seven days a week. These daily runs are in addition to our weekday and weekend schedules.

- Run 601 Arriving to Newark Airport at 5:30 a.m.
- Run 603 Arriving to Newark Airport at 11:15 a.m.
- Run 600 Departing Newark Airport
- Run 602 Departing Newark Airport at 1 p.m.

Give Yourself Time



One of the best ways to ensure a positive journey with us, is to reserve your tickets in advance. Waiting until you are in line to board may result in the bus being sold out, leaving you without a seat. Reserving early guarantees your spot and helps us keep the boarding process quick and efficient for everyone.

The same applies to rescheduling. If you wait until the last minute to change your reservation, the bus you hope to switch to may already be full or sales are cut off because it is too close to departure time. By rescheduling ahead of time, you increase your chances of securing a seat on your newly intended bus and avoiding unnecessary stress.

Reduced Fares

At Trans-Bridge Lines, we strive to provide flexible travel options and a smooth experience for all of our passengers. To ensure fairness and consistency, we want to remind riders of our policy regarding Reduced Fare tickets.

Passengers who qualify for Reduced Fare tickets should be sure to purchase the correct fare type at the time of booking. If a passenger purchases an Adult Fare ticket instead of a Reduced Fare, and then uses that ticket for travel, Trans-Bridge Lines cannot provide a refund or credit for the difference in fare.

Once a ticket has been used for travel, it is considered valid and complete. Refunds or credits cannot be issued retroactively.

However, if the ticket has not yet been used, Trans-Bridge will gladly work with passengers to reschedule their travel for another date or time, in accordance with our regular rescheduling policies.

We encourage all passengers to review fare options carefully before completing their purchase to ensure the correct ticket type is selected. Our goal is to provide the best possible service while maintaining consistent and fair policies for everyone who rides with us.

Reminder Flemington Bus Stop

Due to circumstances beyond our control, the usual parking area at Liberty Village, Flemington, is unavailable until further notice.

Passengers are asked to park at the **Hunterdon** County Link Bus Transfer Center at 80 Park Avenue, Flemington, which is approximately five minutes (1 mile) from Liberty Village.

Fraudsters Could Be Imperonsating Your Bank



A scam involving spoofed phone calls- where fraudsters disguise their caller ID to appear as if they're calling from the bank- is on the rise.

Red Flags to Watch For:

The caller pressures you to share login credentials or sensitive information. They create a sense of urgency, demanding immediate payment of "owed" funds or that a potentially fraudulent transaction is leaving your account. The payment request lacks supporting documentation and comes

through unusual channels.

Protect Yourself:

The bank will never call you to ask for your online banking password, security codes, or full account numbers over the phone.

If a call feels suspicious, hang up immediately and contact your bank directly.

Always verify payment requests through an independent source before taking any action.
